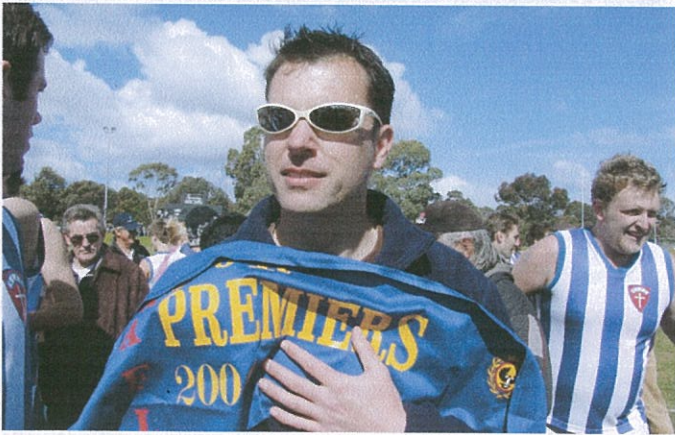

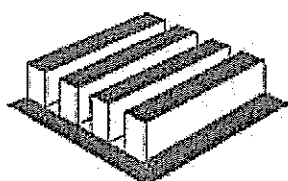

2004 Game By Game Roundup

Round 1

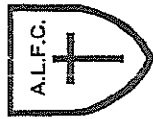
